

Required tools: Installation of the Cab Protector requires a torque wrench capable of measuring 18, 20 & 80 ft-lbs, 1/2", 9/16" & 3/4" Sockets, a 5/16" Drill bit and Drill, and wiring equipment.

Diagram note: Installation instructions show parts for Model: PUCP7502. Model: PUCP7503 parts vary in size and shape but have identical installation procedures. (The cab protector is smaller and item 4 has a notch rather than a hole)





Do not modify this product in any manner. Doing so could alter its integrity and lead to a loss of attachment between the Cab Protector and truck.



PREPARE FOR INSTALLATION

Verify proper fit of Cab Protector. Place the bed protectors on the pickup sides as shown in Figure A1. Make sure the bed protector flange is pushed tightly against the front of the bed and the inside of the bed sides. Measure across the truck from the center of the middle threaded stud on the driver side to the center of the middle stud on the passenger side. Next, measure the distance between the two middle mounting slots on each side of the cab protector. The two measurements should be within 1/2" of each other.





Figure A1: View looking at front of bed.

INSTALL BED PROTECTORS

NOTE: If your truck does not have a forward stake pocket hole in the plastic bed cover you will need to "pull up" the plastic bed cover to gain access to the stake pocket. Replace the cover after the mounting bracket is installed

Install mounting brackets. Locate the driver and passenger side mounting brackets. Each bracket will be installed in the stake pocket with the threaded hole offset toward the cab, see Figure B1. The flanges of the brackets will be under the plastic bed rail covers. Start by inserting the bracket into the stake pocket, then, angle the top of the bracket so one flange slips under the edge of the plastic bed cover, see Figure B2. Push the bracket under the plastic until the flange on the other side of the bracket is past the edge of the stake pocket. Push the bracket down so that both bracket flanges are against the metal body of the truck. Pull the bracket so that the flange on the other side of the bracket is under the plastic, see Figure B3. Align the threaded hole in the bracket with the hole in the stake pocket until centered, see Figure B4.



2. Install 1/2" hardware: Place the bed protectors back on the bed sides, as shown in Figure A1. Locate the 1/2" cap screw, 1/2" lock washer and 1/4" thick spacer block. Place the spacer block between the flange of the bed protector and the outside of the stake pocket. With the lock washer on the 1/2" cap screw, pass the cap screw through the hole in the flange of the bed protector and spacer block, see Figure B5. Thread the cap screw into the mounting bracket installed earlier. Once the cap screw is most of the way in, push the bed protector towards the cab, then tighten the 1/2" cap screw to 80 ft-lbs.




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3. **Drill the hole locations.** Check under the bed rail in the area of each of the square holes in the bed protectors. Make sure there are no lights, wires or other obstructions. Push each bed protector against the inside of the truck bed sides. Using the square holes as a pilot, drill through the truck bed sides using a 5/16" Drill bit.

NOTICE: Galvanic corrosion information.

B&W recommends that the installer references Ford SVE Bulletin Q-222R1 for attaching accessories to aluminum panels and structure. It can be found at www.fleet.ford.com/truckbbas.

4. Install the carriage bolts. Insert a 5/16" X 1-1/2" Carriage Bolt in each of the drilled holes and secure using a flat washer, lock washer and finish nut, see Figure B6. Tighten each nut to 18 ft-lbs.



INSTALL CAB PROTECTOR

- **WARNING:** Components of the Cab Protector are heavy and cumbersome to handle. Failure to use proper lifting techniques and an adequate amount of people when moving and handling the Cab Protector could result in property damage or serious injury.
- 1. Mount Cab Protector. Position the slots on the bottom of the cab protector over threaded studs on the bed protectors, see Figure C1. Fasten the cab protector with the provided 3/8" Large flat washers, lock washers, and finish nuts. Before fully tightening, make sure the cab protector is centered with the truck as viewed from the rear. Then tighten the 6 nuts on the cab protector to 20 ft-lbs. Do not overtighten.




Figure C1: View looking at back of truck.

Install Wiring. Splice the tail of the cab protector wiring harness into the vehicle's wiring. The Green wire is for the passenger side turning signal and braking. The Yellow wire is for the driver side turning signal and braking. The Brown wire is for clearance. The White wire is for ground. Remove excess wire so that there is not any loose wiring. Be sure that wiring is protected from sharp edges or other obstacles that could damage the wires. When installed correctly the two outside lights will function as stop, turn, and tail lights while the inside two lights will only function as tail lights.
