

BX3764 Installation Instructions 2005 Toyota Echo

Serial No.

The front fascia, metal bumper, bumper brackets and windshield washer reservoir are removed for baseplate installation. Drilling is required. Trimming of air dam is required. The bulb and socket tail light wiring kit (BX8869) is available for the vehicle. Attachment Tabs are 24 inches

center to center and a height of 14 1/2 inches.



1. Remove the push pin from just below hood latch on top side of fascia.



3. Remove the nine metric bolts from the lower edge of fascia with the 10MM socket (Driver's side shown).



5. Remove the two metric bolts from metal bumper using the 12MM socket, both sides. Pull metal bumper forward and set aside.



2. Just forward of front tire is one metric bolt to remove with the 10MM socket, on both sides.



4. Using the small flat screw driver, release the clip just outside headlight assembly on seam between the fender and front fascia, both sides. Pull corner of fascia down and to the side of vehicle, pull fasica forward and set aside.



6. Remove the two metric bolts from bumper bracket, pull forward and set aside, on both sides.









7. Release the two clips on the back side of radiator support and pull air dam forward set aside, on both sides (Left photo above). Measure down 1 7/8" and mark the air dam from the edge just below where the metal bumper would set. Cut and remove the area below metal bumper back to first rib, down to 1 7/8" mark and cut a line forward to front edge. This will open area for baseplate.





8. Using the 10MM socket, remove the front metric bolt from windsheild washer reservoir (Left Photo). Loosen the metric bolt on the back side of reservoir (Right Photo).









9. Slide the base plate onto the frame rail to align with the existing two holes on the driver's side. Install the two 10MM-1.25 x 35MM bolts, lock washers and flat washer, as shown in the drawing on the last page. Slide the end plate between frame and washer reservoir on passenger's side, align the lower back hole of the base plate with the existing hole for washer reservoir. Install 6MM-1 x 30MM hex bolt, lock washer and flat washer as shown in the drawing on the last page. Be sure and use Loctite red on all bolts before tightening. Tighten all bolts according to torque chart in the General Instruction sheet. Using the base plate as a template drill the upper back hole on the driver's side and the three holes on the passenger side, with the 13/32" drill bit. Drill a hole in the end of the frame rail with the 1 1/2" hole saw, on both sides.



- 10. Insert nut plates into opening on the end of frame rail to align with drilled holes on the passenger's side, tighten the three 3/8-16 hex bolts lock washers and flat washer, please refer to page 5. Be sure and use Loctite on all bolts before tightening. Torque all bolts according to torque chart in General Instructions.
- **12.** Reinstall and tighten front 6MM-1 hex bolt into washer reservoir and tighten reservoir back bolt. Reinstall bumper brackets and metal bumper.



11. Insert nut plates into opening on the end of frame rail to align with drilled holes on the driver's side, tighten the 3/8-16 hex bolt and lock washer, please refer to page 5. Be sure and use Loctite on all bolts before tightening.

Torque all bolts according to torque chart in General Instructions.










- **13.** Align front fascia as close to it's original position as possible, cut opening in the lower grill to allow attachment receivers and convenience links to come through, both sides. Reinstall fascia. **Be sure that all eletrical components are plugged in properly.**
- 14. The dimensional variations between otherwise identical cars can be considerable. While the base plate was designed for easy installation, it may be necessary to tailor the baseplate slightly to compensate for auto manufacturers' tolerances. These minor adjustments may include filing a hole slightly, bending electrical rods, adding shims and/ or bending endplates.
- **15.** Install the tow bar and safety cables according to the instructions included in their packages.
- **16.** Do **not** substitute other devices if the tow bar pin and clip are lost.









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

Repair parts may be ordered through your nearest **Blue Ox** dealer or distributor.

General Information

- 1. Ensure that your product(s) are registered online at www.blueox.com. It is crucial to register your product(s) so that you may be alerted of product offerings, updates, upgrades, maintenance and safety bulletins, and/ or recalls.
- 2. It is the owner's responsibility to inspect all towing equipment for cracked welds, missing or worn parts and loose bolts before each towing trip. Be sure to use Loctite® Red on all bolts and tighten to the recommended specifications.
- 3. It is the owner's responsibility to hook up all towing equipment per manufacturer's instructions/recommendations.
- 4. Remove the attachment tabs when not in use (if applicable).

Notice To Baseplate Installer

- 1. It is YOUR responsibility to watch for:
 - Oil cooler and air conditioner lines
 - Electrical wires and hoses
 - Missing parts or attaching points on the frame
 - ** If the baseplate is improperly installed and is against a wire or hose, it could cause fluid leaks or electrical shorts some time after the actual baseplate installation.

Permanent Baseplate Safety Cable Installation

Permanent baseplate safety cables are strongly recommended when towing a vehicle with a tow bar. The principle function of the permanent baseplate safety cables is to prevent the towed vehicle from breaking loose in the event the connection between the frame of the towed vehicle and the baseplate fails or becomes disconnected. The cables must be connected from the baseplate to the frame rail or cross member of the vehicle's frame. The illustrations below show the possible arrangements recommended by Blue Ox®. Each permanent baseplate safety cable must have an adequate weight rating for the towing system. The weight rating of the two (2) cables together will not qualify.

Do not mount the permanent baseplate safety cables against wires, hoses or brake lines.

These permanent baseplate safety cables should remain installed as long as the baseplate is installed on the vehicle. Permanent baseplate safety cables are to be used in conjunction with, and NOT a replacement for legally required safety cables attaching the towed vehicle to the towing vehicle.
